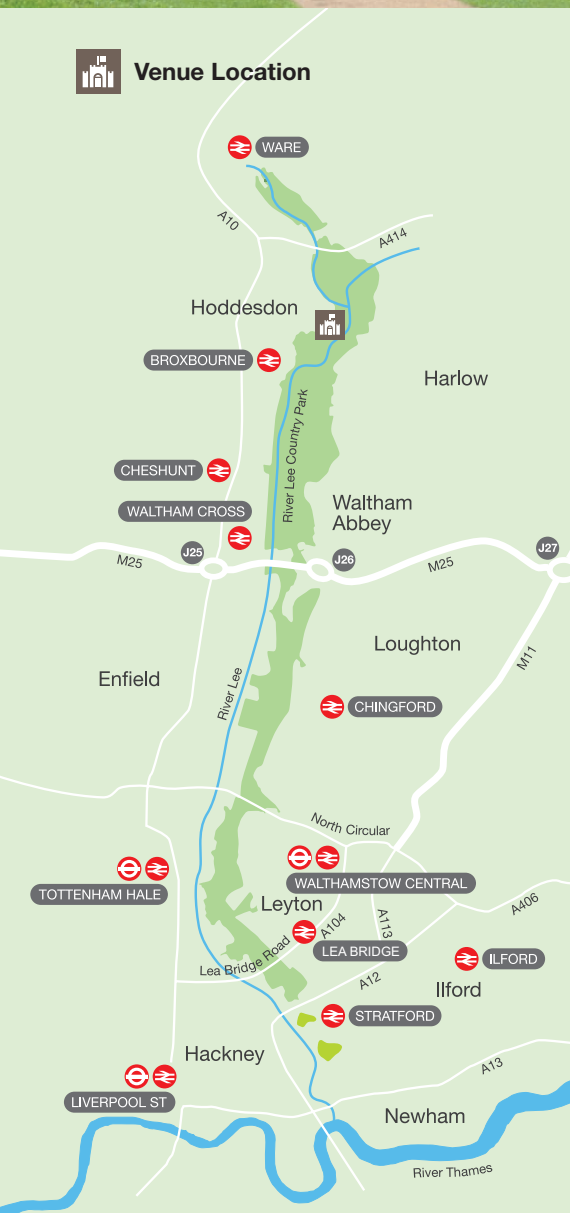




Venue Location



Grade I listed scheduled monument

Rye House Gatehouse is one of the first brick built houses in the country and this was a structure that projected power, prestige and wealth. The detail and craftsmanship in features like the oriel windows and stonework are outstanding in this heritage site. Climb the winding stairs to the viewing platform and you can also appreciate the amazing barley twist chimneys.

The site also boasts the well preserved remains of a medieval moat which is connected to the river.

Adoption of this site will support the maintenance required for this scheduled monument to ensure that it's kept in top condition for future generations to enjoy.
