## Reclaimed gravel pits thrive

The site was once a gravel extraction site, but now the machines are gone the pits are flooded and a host of birds have made the area their home. The site also has an important wildflower meadow which when in bloom in the summer provides important habitats for insects. Reedbeds are a key component of this site and continue to play a part in the restoration programme in the Lee Valley.

Adopting this site will support the work that the park undertakes to support the biodiversity of the site for the wide variety of birds who can be found here.
