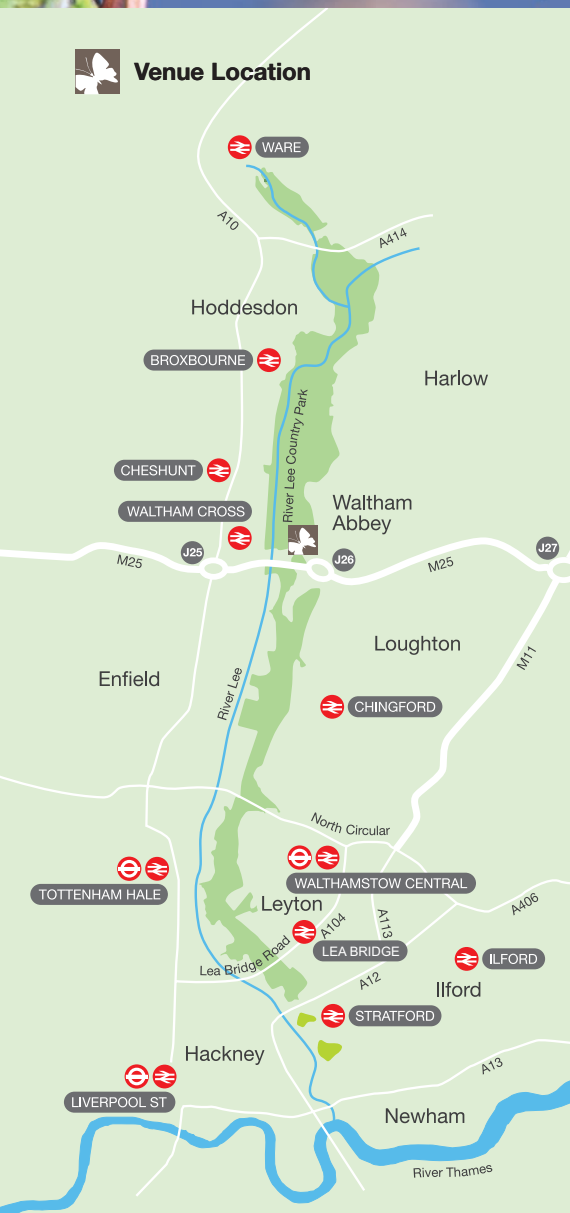

Floodplain grassland of the Lee Valley

One of the best examples of semi-natural floodplain grassland remaining in Lee Valley Regional Park, its mosaic of rivers, ditches and pools makes it a fantastic place to see a variety of wildlife throughout the year.

This is one of the best places in the region to see a range of dragonflies and is designated as a dragonfly sanctuary. The muddy margins provide excellent feeding ground for wading birds and ducks passing through on migration. The tree park is key for butterflies as well as wet woodland bird species.

Adoption of this site will support the maintenance of the floodplain grassland habitat so important for sustaining dragonflies and our tree park for butterflies.

Facilities

- Area where marquees can be erected
- Car parking for up to 40 cars
- Transport links: main line train station 20 minute walk and easy access from junction 26 of M25

- Guided tours of the site with a Ranger
- Team building activities such as Scavenger Hunt, Human Knot, The Mine Field or The Egg Drop
- Catering available such as buffets and BBQs
