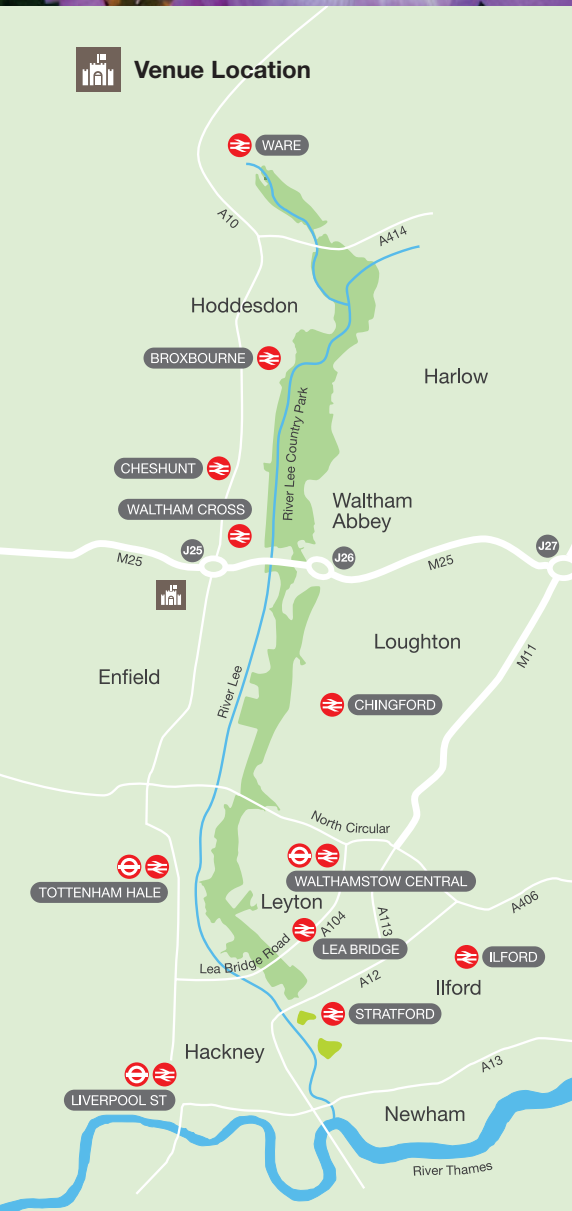

The beautiful eight acres of Myddelton House Gardens tells the story of Edward Augustus Bowles, one of Britain's most famous self-taught gardeners, artists and expert botanists. There's an impressive range of flora and fauna in the garden including the oldest Corkscrew Hazel in London. The family friendly gardens are impressive whatever the time of year but especially in spring and summer. The Kitchen Garden and Victorian Glasshouse were restored in 2011 and further restoration work continues throughout the gardens. Home to four national collections of plants it's an important historic garden for horticulturalists as well as a Grade II registered landscape.

An amazing landscape which we know you'll be proud to support as a legacy to horticulture and plantsmanship. Adoption of this site will help support further projects such as restoration of the Rock Garden or pond.

Facilities

- Surfaced pathways which may be uneven in places but mostly accessible
- Toilets

- Transport links: main line train station 15 minute walk and easy access from junction 25 on M25

- Meeting room use within the Grade II listed building with full IT facilities, hearing loop and refreshments
