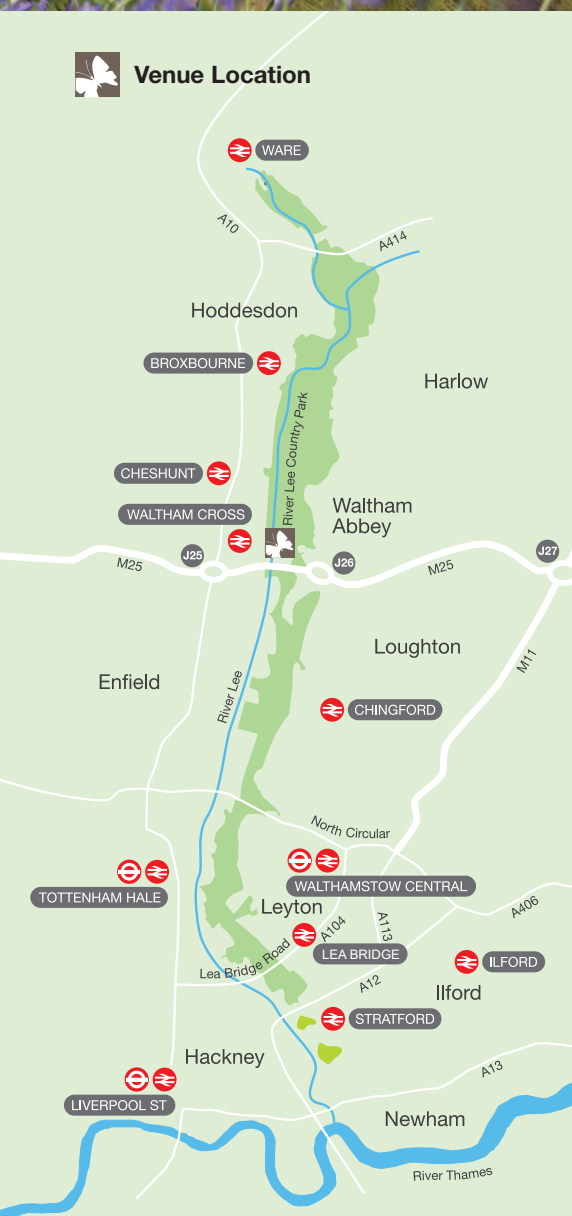

## Grassland and meadow habitat

Areas of grassland and meadows are important and uncommon habitats in the Lee Valley and Turnford and Cheshunt Marsh is one of our specialist sites for this important habitat. The meadows are also important habitats for wild flowers and increase our biodiversity by being managed in a wildlife sensitive manner using old English goats to graze it.

Income received from adoption of this site will be used to support and enhance the habitat management works that we undertake on the grassland and meadows.

### Facilities

- Area where marquees can be erected
- Car parking for up to 40 cars – 10 minute walk
- Transport links: main line train station 10 minute walk and easy access from junction 25 on M25
