The Head of Planning introduced the report informing Members that the gardens for this site sit in the Green Belt and it is located in the northern part of the River Lee Country Park.

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Whilst private land, it does provide an important part for both the landscape and ecology of the River Lee Country Park.

Members commented on whether the applicant might be trying to get this application through planning prior to new legislation coming into effect in January for Biodiversity Net Gain.

A Member expressed concerns that no amenity space had been provided and wondered whether there might be an opportunity to request S106 money. He further cautioned that this application is only outline and therefore the layout of the site might change and that a suitable landscape buffer and ecological surveys should be completed before a decision is made.

The Chairman suggested that the fact that the application site is in the Green Belt should be mentioned in the recommendation.

A Member commented that there is a legal requirement for care homes to have 1 parking space per 3 beds, this is to accommodate both staff and residents. This application will not have sufficient parking spaces.

- (1) that Epping Forest District Council be informed that the Authority objects to the outline application for the demolition of existing bungalows and the construction of a two storey care home and 12 single storey bungalows at 83 Old Nazeing Road, the majority of which would sit within the Green Belt, on the grounds that:
 - (a) the proposal is contrary to Park Development Framework Area Proposals as they relate to Area 6.A.4 The River Lee Country Park;
 - (b) the proposed development would impact negatively on the landscape character and ecology of the River Lee Country Park;
 - (c) protected species surveys have not been provided and as such there is insufficient information on which to assess the proposed development for biodiversity impacts, which should be a material consideration in this case; and
 - (d) a Biodiversity Net Gain assessment is required to demonstrate biodiversity net gain can be achieved on site was approved.
