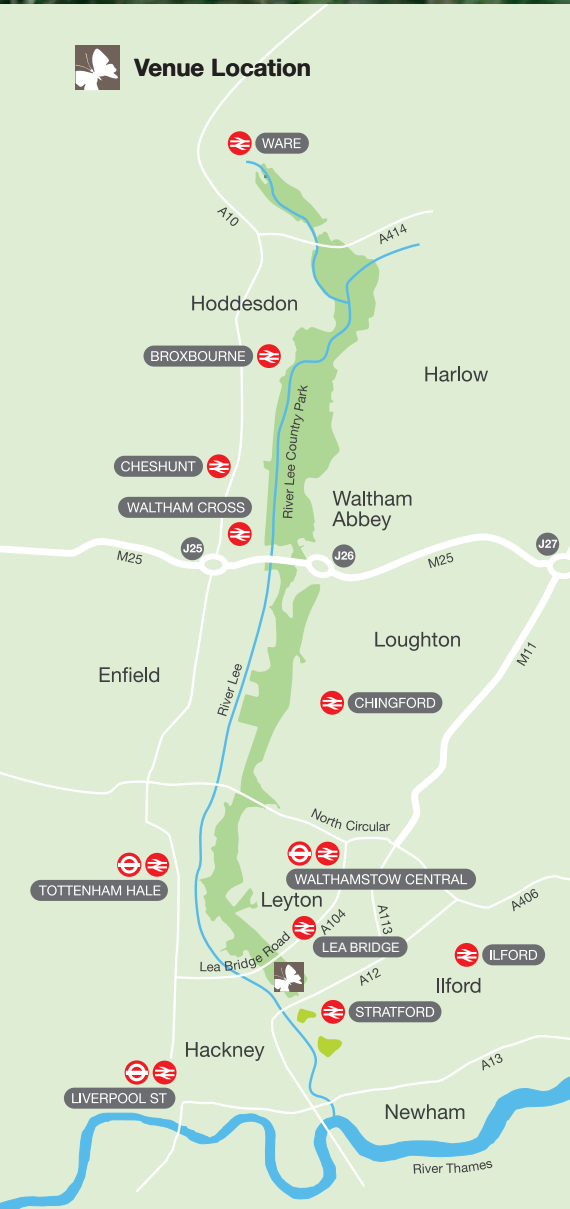




Venue Location



A unique wildlife haven for wetland birds

Previously known as the Essex Filter Beds, over 150 years ago it began supplying the surrounding boroughs with much needed clean water. The reserve has one of the largest bird hides in London offering close-up views of a range of wildlife. This site is an important educational site and has regular inner city school groups visiting to learn about nature and the environment.

Support from adopting this site will be used to maintain the unique environment created from the old filter beds.
