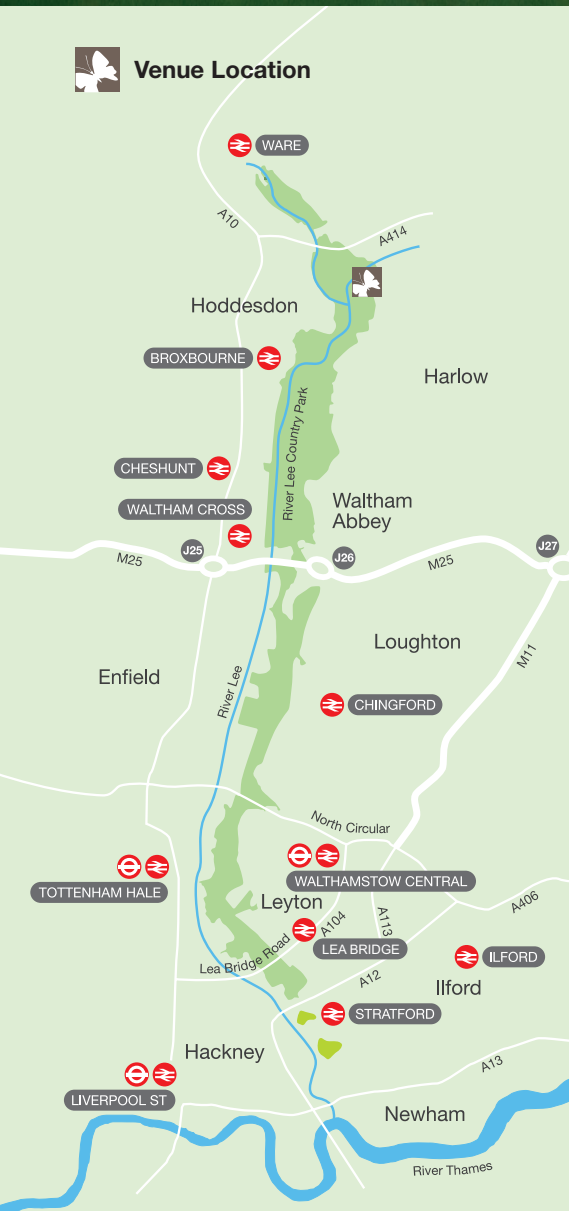

Important wildlife refuge

Glen Faba is an area of open water, grassland and reedbed which is a very important wildlife site in the Lee Valley. The lake is also a season permit angling venue which is managed to enhance the environment and habitat for the wildlife who lived here. The surrounding areas of the lake are environmentally grazed by cattle to ensure minimal man-made disturbance for wildlife. One of the most important features is an island which is home to one of the few heron colonies in the Lee Valley.

Adopting this site will support the management of the lake and the biodiversity of the site.

Facilities

- Large area where marquees can be erected overlooking the lake
- Car parking

Additional corporate activities available (charges apply)

- Guided tours of the site with a Ranger
- Team building activities such as Scavenger Hunt, Human Knot, The Mine Field or the Egg Drop
- Catering available such as buffets and BBQs
- Events can be arranged
