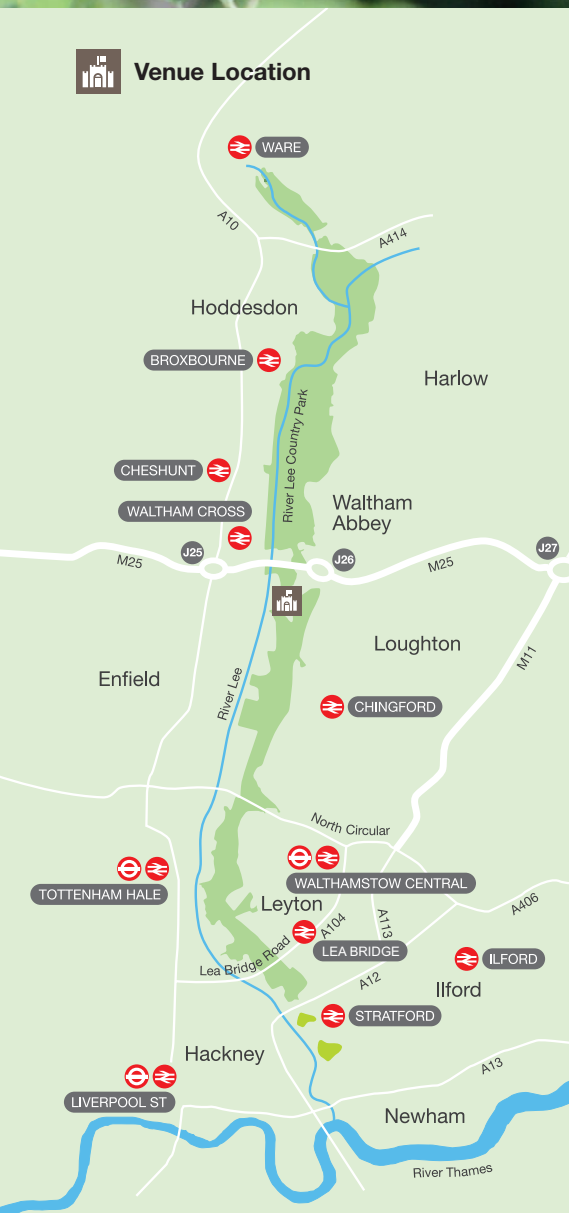

Reclamation and transformation triumph

This site used to be closed to the public as it was a munitions testing area run by the Ministry of Defence. Following its closure and falling into disrepair Lee Valley Regional Park has transformed it into an exciting country park for people and wildlife. The park boasts rolling landscapes with an array of meadows and wildflowers on the edge of London.

Wooden sculptures with wildlife themes are dotted throughout the park and give visitors a unique experience. Landscaped to reflect the history of the area the grassland supports a thriving insect community.

Adoption of this site will support the constant management of the invasive plant species which can be found at the site and to help maintain the wildlife habitats.

Facilities

- Large area where marquees can be erected
- Toilets
- Car parking for up to 40 cars
- Transport links: easy access from junction 26 on M25
