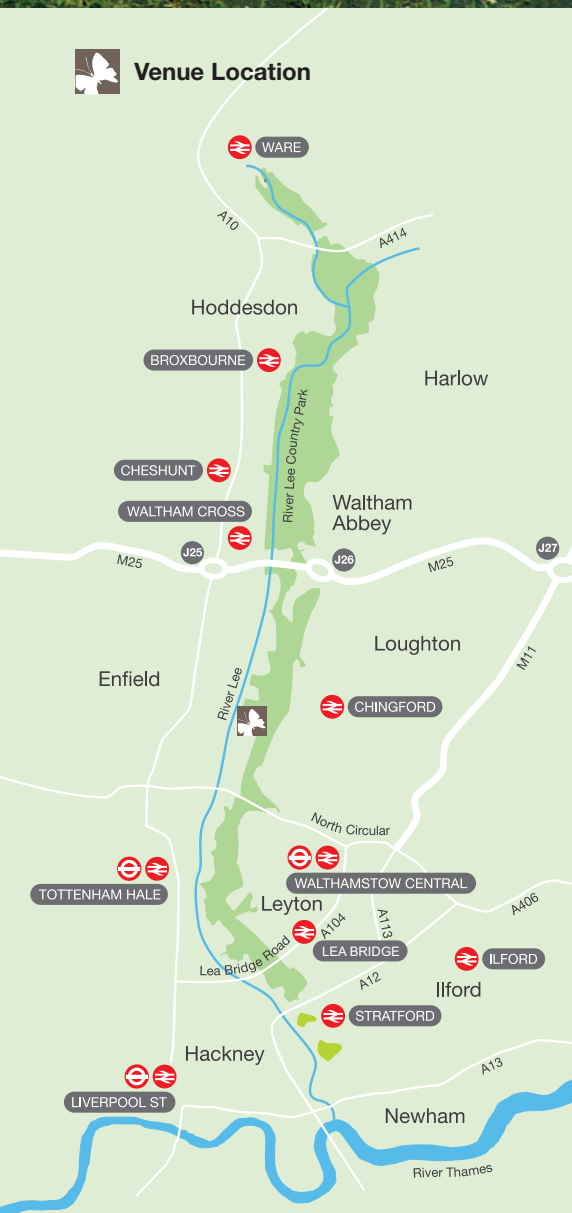

Thriving wetland habitat

Sewardstone Marsh is a rarity in modern Britain – a wetland habitat where you can enjoy discovering thriving populations of animals and plants. These marshes are vital for hundreds of wildlife species.

Gravel extraction has left pools which are perfect for dragonflies and aquatic animals. The natural seasonal flooding of parts of the area attract wintering birds and in the summer these pools provide the perfect habitat for breeding wading birds.

Adoption of this site will help support the biodiversity work that is undertaken to maintain this wetland habitat.
